### Tickets on Sale for the Palisade Bluegrass and Roots Festival in Western Colorado

If you enjoy listening to live music in beautiful outdoor settings, consider the Palisade Bluegrass and Roots Festival, which takes place in the town of Palisade's Riverbend Park in western Colorado, June 14-16.

Riverbend Park sits alongside the Colorado River, with views of Grand Mesa and the Book Cliff Mountains, and the shade of majestic, old cottonwood trees.

Saturday's headliner band is Railroad Earth – a New Jersey-based band with a strong Colorado connection. Railroad Earth performs 75-90 shows per year nationwide, including Colorado's renowned Red Rocks Amphitheater in Morrison, Colorado, and the Telluride Bluegrass Festival.

John Skehan, who performs mandolin, bouzouki, piano, and vocals for the band, describes Railroad Earth as a rock band made up of bluegrass musical instruments. Although they've always been "plugged in," the band has become even more electric since keyboardist Matt Slocum and Mike Robinson, who plays banjo, pedal steel and acoustic guitar, joined the group, Skehan said. Other members include Dave Speranza performing upright and electric bass, Todd Sheaffer on lead vocals and acoustic guitar, Tim Carbone on violins, electric guitar and vocals, and Carey Harmon performing drums, hand percussion and vocals.

Railroad Earth has a fan base that often follows them from town to town, including multiple nights on Colorado's Front Range this past year, where concertgoers attended a different concert every night. "We always mix it up," Skehan said. "After all these years, we have a repertoire where we can play four nights in a row and not repeat songs."

"The Palisade festival has a great lineup," including banjo player Tony Trischka, whose Sunday "Earl Jam" performance is a tribute to Earl Scruggs, said Skehan.

Skehan is also a huge fan of Rapidgrass, who performs on Friday.

Saturday's lineup also includes Mild Goose Chase, Two Runner (who's performed at the Moab Folk Festival),

Tray Wellington, and Rob Ickes and Trey Hensley. And on Sunday, in addition to the Earl Jam performance, the Main Stage will feature Good Morning Bedlam, The Last Revival, and Mipso.

favorite Stray Grass, followed by The Fretlines, Rebecca Frazier's Grateful Strings, closing out the day with Rapidgrass.

Between acts the music continues on side stages where that weekend you'll find Deer Creek Sharp Shooters on Sunday, Still House String Band on Saturday, and Tone Wood String Band performing on Sunday.



Every Wednesday, traditional bluegrass music returns to the theater. The band Quicksand Soup performs oldtime standards and unique originals starting at 7 pm. The free show has become a downtown fixture over the last few years and it's common to see both locals and tourists alike tapping their toes.

Thursday, it's country night with Moab's own honkytonk fusion/ Americana outfit, Juniper Drive takes the stage for a free show at 7. Fridays is the new "Original" night, often featuring Sand and Sunnie Sheff. Friday May 3rd has Local funk band Sun Flood

Saturdays, Moab's Magic show returns with the award-winning magic of Rick Boretti. Rick's hilarious routine changes constantly, but always involves lots of wisecracks and mystifying magic tricks.
