Colorado Music Hall of Famer Yonder Mountain String Band to Perform in Western Colorado

The Yonder Mountain String Band was founded in Nederland, Colorado in 1998, and inducted into the Colorado Music Hall of Fame in 2021 at the Telluride Bluegrass Festival – joining musical legends John Denver, Judy Collins, Glen Miller, and Joe Walsh.

"They're the first bluegrass band to take it to rock 'n' roll," said Telluride Bluegrass Festival Director Craig Ferguson, the *Telluride Daily Planet* reported at the time.

The progressive bluegrass Yonder Mountain band will perform a show Friday, March 8 at the Mesa Theater in downtown Grand Junction.

With its roots in bluegrass, Yonder Mountain blends elements of rock, alternative, and improvisational music, while performing at clubs, theaters, performing arts centers

and outdoor festivals throughout United States.

Y o n d e r Mountain founding members include Ben Kaufmann on bass and vocals; Dave Johnston performing



banjo and vocals; and Adam Aijala on guitar and vocals. Nick Piccininni, who joined the band in 2020, performs banjo, mandolin, and fiddle, as well as vocals.

Joining the band on this year's tour is "fiddle shredder" Coleman Smith, co-founder of the Colorado-based band Rapidgrass, where he played fiddle for more than a decade. Currently Smith plays regularly with Yonder Mountain String Band, David Lawrence and the Spoonful, and The Bluegrass Journeymen.

Yonder Mountain's most recent release was the Grammy-nominated Get Yourself Outside, an album born during the pandemic. The album title is a lyric from the album's final song Suburban Girl. The band is currently finishing up a studio album planned for release in the fall

While concertgoers might hear a couple of new songs from the upcoming album, after 26 years of performing the band has a huge repertoire that includes hundreds of songs, said Kaufmann. The band chooses not to have a set play list that it uses throughout a tour, instead, the band waits until they arrive to a town before compiling a playlist for a particular concert.

"We'll write the set list that day from what inspires us to perform in that moment," Kaufmann says. Oftentimes bands will create a set playlist that they repeat over and over, from town to town - "that's not how we do it."

Also onsite this year is the beloved local family food Local, truck, El with southwestern and Mexican taste sensation specialties all made fresh to order.


