The Gourd Festival takes you back in time. A time where things were, simpler, handmade, stress free. A time when families engage together to have fun.


But, "HOW MUCH WILL THIS COST ME???" you ask. How about... FREE. Everything is free. Which makes you free to relax.



The Bluff Arts Festival started in 2005 at the St.



The Artist Market returns to the Bluff Community Center this


