## Delicate Stitchers Quilt Guild's 23<sup>rd</sup> Annual Themed Quilt Show

The Moab Museum is pleased to showcase the annual Delicate Stitchers Quilt Show beginning Saturday, July 6th. This year is the Quilt Guild's twenty-third Annual Themed Challenge Show and the twenty-third year at the Moab Museum. This year's theme, *Seasons*, gives quilters the interpretive challenge of either calendar seasons or personal seasons. A variety of techniques and styles have been incorporated this year, including machine and hand-quilting as well as hand-embroidery, painting, and appliqué which display the artistic personalities of each of the participants.

This year, the Quilt Guild's Challenge Show presents 29 individual pieces from 12 different artists, including 5 "encore" quilts, which have been shown in previous years but fit into this year's theme.

#### Art Walk: Friday, August 2nd

Viewers are invited to vote for their favorite quilts and visit with quilters themselves during the Moab Arts "Art Walk" on Friday, August 2nd from 5-8 p.m., the FREE opening of the Quilt Show. August's Art Walk also provides an opportunity for visitors to share their own "seasonal" stories with Annie Dalton, the current Community Artist in the Parks at the National Park Service's Southeast Utah Group. Dalton is gathering stories related to native plants, their uses, and any seasonal traditions community members engage in as part of her creative work within the parks. If you have any stories to share, pull up a chair and join Dalton at the Museum during Art Walk to record a story.

The Quilt Show will be on display through Saturday, August 17th, just prior to the Moab Museum's exhibition installation closure during the last two weeks of August. To find the Quilt Guild's work following the show, quilters will again present their work in 2026 at the biannual Quilting in the Red Rocks Show.

## Art for the Parks: Linocutting with Local Artist Riley Lubich







#### **Exhibition at Dead Horse Point State Park Visitor Center**

Spirit and Grit: Ranching in Canyonlands

Explore the story of settlers who pieced together a hardscrabble living in early Moab, from the 1870s onward, in this temporary exhibit at the Dead Horse State Park Visitor Center. Visitors to Spirit and Grit experience a window into the lives of some of these early settlers through this immersive satellite exhibit.

Spirit and Grit, an extension of stories told at the Moab Museum, was curated by the Moab Museum's Curatorial and Collections Manager, in collaboration with the Moab Museum of Film and Western Heritage (MMFWH), and with assistance from longtime Moabite and local historian Mark Beeson. Featuring historic photographs, objects, stories, and a life-sized cow camp, the exhibition paints a vibrant portrait of ranch life in the area of canyonlands at the turn of the twentieth century.
