Music, Storytelling, Humor Coming to Grand Junction's Avalon Theatre

There are at least two reasons to consider a trip to western Colorado in March.

On Friday, March 17, singer-songwriter A.J. Croce will perform "Croce Plays Croce" - an evening of music that will feature classic songs by his late father Jim Croce, who died in a plane crash when A.J was 2. Jim Croce was an American folk singer, whose records sold more than 50 million.

And on Friday, March 31, Garrison Keilor will take the stage for a night of storytelling, humor, poetry and music.

Both events take place at the Avalon Theatre in downtown Grand Junction.

A.J. Croce is a virtuoso piano player and will perform a complete set of classics by his father – songs like *Operator*, Time in a Bottle, and You Don't Mess Around with Jim, as well as some of his own music, plus songs that influenced both him and his father.

Around the age of 4, A.J. Croce lost his sight due to horrific abuse from his mother's then-boyfriend. He spent

pianists Ray Charles and Stevie Wonder. He regained sight in his left

eye when he was 10. A.J. Croce has toured with artists such as Willie Nelson; Lenny Kravitz; Earth, Wind and Fire; and B.B. King. He's produced 10 studio albums that have all landed on several charts, including Top 40, Blues, Americana, Jazz, College, and Radio 1.

Garrison Keilor

Many may remember Garrison Keilor from "A Prairie Home Companion," a radio show performed before an

audience that he hosted for 40 years. The writer-comedian invented a town called Lake Wobegon, "where all the children are above average, even though he himself grew up Garrison Keilor



evangelical in a small separatist flock where all the children expected the imminent end of the world," according to his web site.



Keilor's "Garrison Keilor Tonight" at the Avalon on March 31, will feature sonnets, limericks, and musical jokes, touching on the theme of "the beauty of growing old."

The evening will include an a cappella sing-along with the audience singing from memory an odd medley of patriotic songs, pop standards, and hymns, ending with the national anthem.

Since his retirement Keilor has written a memoir, and a book

of limericks, and is working on a musical and a Lake Wobegon screenplay. He also continues to do "The Writers Almanac" which is sent out daily to Internet subscribers for free.

Doors open for both of these events at 6:30 p.m., with shows starting at 7:30 p.m. Tickets range from \$29-\$49.




Moab Backyard Theater Returns for 2023: Celebrating 10 Years!
